About Benjamin Knauer

Benjamin was from Wurttemberg, Germany. His children were all born in Germany. The family came to Richmond in two parties, between 1851 (Herman) and 1854 (all the others). They were a family of blacksmiths. Benjamin and Caroline both died in 1860 (after the census was taken), whether at about the same time or not is not known. Their place of burial has not been discovered.

NOTES

Herman Knauer (1826) was in his early twenties when he came to Richmond in 1851. Other family members came in 1854. Herman, like his brothers and his father, was a blacksmith. He married Ann Gerback. After 1860 his family moved from Richmond to DuQuoin, Illinois, where he died in 1873. He had three daughters; Amelia (1858), Mary (1860), and Helen (1861). Two

graves in Lakeview Cemetery may be Herman's children. J.B. Robert Knauer died November 1, 1856, age one year, one day. Eda Knauer died October 12, 1859, age 37 days.

Paulina Knauer (1831) was about twenty when her family came to Honeoye. She and her husband Andrew Seyferth (1828-1888) settled in Jackson County, Illinois. They had seven children: William (1857), Andrew (1859), Mary (1863), August (1864), Emily (1871), George (1873), and Margaret (1875).

Rudolph Knauer (1832) and his wife, Christiana (1833-1923) lived in Honeoye on West Lake Road (No. 20). His blacksmith shop was on the south side of Main Street, just west of the creek, but east of the mill race. His children were Emma and Martha Louise. Rudolph died May 29, 1890 and is buried in Lakeview Cemetery.

Emma Knauer (1860) was born in Honeoye September 3, 1860. She married Frank Hoagland (1857-1916); they had no children. Emma died December 30, 1897 and is buried in Lakeview Cemetery.

Martha Knauer (1862) was born in Honeoye December 11, 1862. She married Elmer Davis (1861-1942) December 19, 1888 in Honeoye (Rev. S. Mills Day). They had one daughter, Meda (1892). Martha died December 28, 1896 and is buried in Lakeview Cemetery.

Christina Hirsch (1833) was born in July 1833, the daughter of Rudolph Hirsch and Elizabeth Webber; she may have been a cousin of Ernest's wife Louisa. She died March 16, 1923.

William Knauer (1835) settled in Marion County, Illinois. He and his wife Julia (1833-1929) had six children: Emile, Lena, Adolph, Ida, Otto, and Louise.

Frederick Knauer (1840) was born May 19, 1840 in Germany. He and his wife Mary (1838-1931) lived in Jackson County, Illinois. He died October 31, 1900.

Ernest Frederick William Knauer (1844) was born December 28, 1844 in Germany. He was about six when the family left Germany and came to Richmond. He was a blacksmith. He was in the Civil War, Company E, of the 120th N.Y. Infantry, as a substitute for another. At the Battle of Stony Creek in Virginia on June 28, 1864 he received a gunshot wound to the upper right thigh and another to the left hand. Then on October 27, 1865 he was taken prisoner at the Boydton Plank Road in Virginia. He was later paroled. After the war, September 9, 1866, he married Louisa Hirsch (1843-1935) in Honeoye (by S. Mills Day). The minister's record states: "Mr. Ernest Knauer of Macon, Illinois." The couple had seven children: Martha (1867), Otto (1869), Louis (1871), Edward (1872), Louise (1873), Ernst (1875) and Mary (1877). Ernest and Louisa later divorced (1890) and he married Mary L. Milliman on December 14, 1894 in Cook County, Illinois. After she died, he married Emily Yates (1853-1933) on February 6, 1908. He died January 4, 1912 in Calhoun County, Iowa; he is buried in Rose Hill Cemetery in Manson (Calhoun County), Iowa.

Louisa Augusta Hirsch (1843) was the daughter of Gottlieb and Grese (Kloden) Hirsch; she may have been the cousin of Rudolph's wife Christina. They came to Honeoye from Germany when she was very young. She married Ernest Knauer in Honeoye on September 9, 1866, the one-year anniversary of the date he'd been discharged, Rev. S. Mills Day officiating. About 1890 they divorced. Louisa died in 1936 in DuQuoin, Illinois. She is buried in the IOOF Cemetery in DuQuoin.

Adolph Knauer (1846) was in Co. E of the 188th NY Infantry. He died of typhoid after two days illness at City Point, Virginia, October 27, 1864.
